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Studies on the judicialization of “gender violence” and on the dissemination of alternative practices through a comparative perspective between Brazil and Argentina

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PROPOSAL IDENTIFICATION

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ABSTRACT

The objects of this study are the judicialization and the alternative justice practices in the field of “gender violence”. In broad lines, it aims to map and describe mechanisms and practices for the promotion of justice, of moral reparation and of arbitration in cases of “gender violence” identified by the Brazilian and Argentine justice systems, in a comparative approach. The goals are to organize and to develop the knowledge about judicialization practices in the management of crimes associated with “gender violence”, and to propose guidelines and alternatives to the field of public policies in the area. To this end, it contemplates a partnership between different research groups – LEVIS (UFSC), NIGS (UFSC), Margens (UFSC); GECAL (UNIPLAC); GCS (UFRN) – and between different researchers in Brazil and Argentina, for the fulfillment of field studies in five medium-sized municipalities in Brazil (Florianópolis, Lages, Juiz de Fora, Natal and Uruguaina) and in four municipalities in Argentina (La Plata and Florencio Varela/Buenos Aires; and Orán and Tartagal/Salta), comprising a multidisciplinary and multi-situated network. In addition to mapping and describing justice production practices, identifying mechanisms, strategies and moralities, the project will accompany the creation and installation of an experiment of Restorative Justice in the municipality of Lages, in the mountain region of Santa Catarina. It is an experience by which it will be possible to identify the central elements to the formulation and application of policies in the area, as well as to identify the objective conditions, in each of the studied localities, for the experimentation of similar measures to be addressed with the study partners in their geographic practice areas. The project unfolds in knowledge diffusion activities alongside schools and alongside managers and other state professionals, by means of workshops, debates and digital media experiences, that may amplify and qualify the discussions about alternative practices in cases of “gender violence”.

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1. DESCRIPTION

The objects of this study are the judicialization and the alternative justice practices in the field of “gender violence”. In broad lines, it aims to map and describe mechanisms and practices for the promotion of justice, of moral reparation and of arbitration in cases of “gender violence” identified by the Brazilian and Argentine justice systems, in a comparative approach. The goals are to organize and to develop the knowledge about judicialization practices in the management of crimes associated with “gender violence”, and to propose guidelines and alternatives to the field of public policies in the area.

The theme of “gender violence” has occupied, for decades, an important place both on the academic discussion and on the political agenda. In Brazil, it is contemplated by a vast and always current theoretical production (cf. CORREA, 1983; GREGORI, 1993a, 1993b, 2010; GROSSI, 1995, 1998; SOARES, 1999; DEBERT, 2002; RIFIOTIS, 2004, 2008, 2015; cf. GROSSI, MINELLA, PORTO, 2006; GROSSI, MINELLA, CAVILHA, 2006), it is featured in a number of legislative debates and in the field of social movements (cf. GARCIA, 2016) – like the 11.340/06 act, known as “Lei Maria da Penha” (cf. BRAGAGNOLO, 2012); and the 13.104/15 act, known as “Lei do Feminicídio” (cf. LODETTI, 2016).

In Argentina, specifically, the democratic reform opened an important space for women to demand formal rights and effective tools to intervene alongside institutions. Thus, the focus on legal resources gives rise to a debate that is polarized between the ones that emphasize the criminal law, and point out the need for legal classification of domestic violence, and the ones that argue that private conflicts should be handled by the civil justice. In both cases, the social policies that are intended to reduce or eliminate impunity are characterized by the creation of mechanisms that favor the legal interpretation of family conflicts, tending to their judicialization (BRUNATTI, 2006). The impasses around this discussion are reflected in dilemmas related to the punishability of “gender violence”, to the practices of justice and mediation and to strategies of social awareness about the subject.

In this regard, this project contemplates social experiments that can contribute to this discussion, reflecting critically about mechanisms like “citizen mediation” and “restorative justice” in the context of “gender violence”. We propose a study on judicialization practices and alternative practices of production of justice, putting them into the perspective of both global recommendations - in the form of international documents and agreements - and of local strategies and initiatives for resolution and negotiation of conflicting relationships. We are aware that there is no consensus about the legal and moral viability of the different practices of justice, the same way there’s no unanimity among feminist camps about what constitutes a sufficiently effective legal and punitive approach for the fight against and punishment of “gender violence”. Therefore, what we propose is the reflection on the judicialization and its effects and consequences, considering we are dealing with a field

permeated with multiple and permanent conflicts of meaning. It is about describing mechanisms for the promotion of justice (in its different meanings) and their eventual effects on the daily lives of the subjects of this research.

To this end, it contemplates a partnership between different research groups – LEVIS (UFSC), NIGS (UFSC), Margens (UFSC); GECAL (UNIPALAC); GCS (UFRN) – and between different researchers in Brazil and Argentina, for the fulfillment of field studies in five medium-sized municipalities in Brazil (Florianópolis, Lages, Juiz de Fora, Natal and Uruguaina) and in four municipalities in Argentina (La Plata and Florencio Varela/Buenos Aires; and Orán and Tartagal/Salta), comprising a multidisciplinary and multi-situated network.

We plan on mapping and describing mechanisms of judicialization and alternative practices of negotiation, mediation, moral compensation and promotion of justice from different localities, so as to identify multiple practices and the different effects of judicialization and alternative mechanisms, and to elicit various aspects of the moral economy that disposes the phenomenon of “gender violence” in each of the studied locations. It is through these descriptions, from the survey of each of the studied individuals’ experiences, that we can build comparative analyses and elaborate guidelines for the formulation of public policies that deal with “gender violence”.

Through ethnographic description, we intend to characterize an intervention experiment in the city of Lages/SC, that is based on the idea of Restorative Justice as an alternative measure in the field of “gender violence”. The project is from the Tribunal de Justiça de Santa Catarina (*Santa Catarina State Court of Justice*) and is being prepared to be put into effect in 2017, which would allow us also to describe the processes of implantation, establishment and adaptation of a public policy, as well as its relationships with its users and operators. These observations will allow us to identify elements that can possibly be applied or appropriated into the other studied localities.

This proposal also comprises discussions with different actors of the civil society, other researchers and state agents, in order to seek political measures of short, medium and long terms. We suggest a number of extension activities that pertain to, above all, strategies of education and knowledge dissemination, with the goal of advertising research results and promoting concepts, practices, services and public policies related to “gender violence” and practices of justice. These strategies go from the distribution of informational material to the training of multiplier agents, who will spread the knowledge throughout their institutions, organizations and communities.

2. MULTIDISCIPLINARY COORDINATION

The academic production in the field of “gender violence” reveals a multidisciplinary breadth in the approach of such phenomenon (cf. GROSSI, MINELLA, CAVILHA, 2006). It is noted how “gender violence” constitutes a study subject that is relevant to a variety of academic fields, engaging different theoretical approaches, multiple methodological strategies and distinct political and epistemological reflections. As an object of public opinion and action, “gender violence” also requires that tools and concepts of different disciplinary natures be put into use. The theoretical history of the field of “gender violence” itself enables some sort of common language among the different areas of knowledge that discuss the topic, sharing concepts, categories, approaches, tools of intervention, evaluations on public services, statistic datum and theoretical and political impasses.

This proposal recognizes this multidisciplinary potential of “gender violence”. One of the main goals of this project is the coordination and strengthening of an international network of collaboration, through a multi-situated project, involving distinct fields of knowledge and different political alignments. Therefore, this comparative research undertaking involves both preexistent partnerships, and new cooperation efforts being woven through the activities of this project, that gathers researchers from the areas of Anthropology, Sociology, Psychology, Education, Law and Information Technology.

There is also a potentially multidisciplinary field fostering this proposal, as a result of the dialogues to be entertained, through the research and extension activities, alongside different collaborators and partners related to the field of public policies, to the judiciary and to human rights.

3. SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNOLOGICAL RELEVANCE

The theme of gender violence constitutes an extremely vigorous field, with complex ramifications, especially today. We are using the expression *gender violence* in a generic way as a broader category that encompasses the expression *conjugal violence*, as it will be discussed further on in the project. In broad lines, we refer, thus, to the situations identified by the justice system through the 11.340/2006 act. It also exemplifies the importance of discussion and multidisciplinary and inter-institutional cooperation, between researchers, human rights and social movement activists, managers and other state agents. Over decades of discussions promoted by feminist movements, of research coming from distinct subject areas and of some legislative experiences, a series of standstills are perpetuated, at the same time that many others emerge from current practices. After all, as stated before (RIFIOTIS, 2014, p. 9), as we advance in the field of Human Rights, we observe major violations in relation to it, like unequal access to justice, social inequalities and the precarious treatment conditions of people on the fringe. Therefore, advances and violations – or “difficulties and standoffs” – establish pairs that walk hand in hand, portraying the general picture of Human Rights in Brazil and the difficulties of promoting citizenship and social equality.

The conclusion, then, is that new solutions successively trigger new obstacles. On the one hand, this shows the vigor of the theoretical and political field created around this social phenomenon; on the other hand, it demands that we create new strategies with the goal of challenging, describing and discussing this set of difficulties. The productivity of studies in the field of gender violence, then, does not stop – be it in terms of dealing with the theoretical and epistemological developments that these studies give rise - or in terms of the incentive to the elaboration, evaluation and improvement of public policies.

In theoretical terms, we intend to elicit and evaluate the way in which the theme has been conceived so far, to deepen the discussion and improve on the concepts and methodologies, by means of ethnographic studies and talks with state agents, branches of the civilian society and researchers from different subject areas and different institutions - especially the discussion about the judicialization of gender violence. In social and political terms, we aim at the construction of categories that can handle the nuances of existential dimension implied in the phenomenon in question; of instruments of intervention in conflicts and of sheltering of men and women, as well as resolution strategies for relationships that end in conflict; of alternative intervention in short and medium terms; of tools for the evaluation of public policies. Supported mainly by comprehensive research, this proposal especially focuses on the formulation of guidelines capable of assisting public policies that assist men and women involved in cases of this nature, in terms of negotiating means of moral reparation, similar to the process we set to accompany and analyze in the city of Lages/SC.

As examples of indicators of the potential for innovation of this proposal, we mention:

- Creation of support mechanisms for people involved in “gender violence” situations.
- Development of study material on justice, "gender violence" and rights, and of promotional material about alternative forms of justice.
- Elaboration of diagnoses and guidelines for the formulation of public policies.

4. OBJECTIVES

4.1 General objective:

Promoting a multi-situated study, with the support of a research network, about judicialization and alternative justice practices in the field of “gender violence”, through a comparative approach between Brazil and Argentina, with the goal of fostering guidelines for the development of public policies in the area.

4.2 Specific objectives:

- to identify and carry out a systematic analysis of normative texts related to “gender violence” in Brazil and Argentina;
- to develop a comparative study between regions of Brazil and between Brazil and Argentina about judicialization practices and alternative practices that relate to “gender violence”.

A. Regarding the research in Brazil (Florianópolis, Lages, Uruguaina, Juiz de Fora, Natal)

- to systematize the main concepts and theoretical camps that are relevant to the establishment and development of the study field of “gender violence”;
- to identify public services and other initiatives that offer shelter, guidance and/or support or discussion groups for women victims of violence, or for men accused of aggression;
- to map the institutions that promote gender conflict management through mediation and conciliation;
- to describe judicial/judicialization processes and practices related to “gender violence”;
- to identify and describe alternative practices and experiences of justice;
- to describe, through ethnographic research, moral assumptions and local prerogatives related to “gender violence”, between victims and perpetrators;
- to describe, through ethnographic research, moral assumptions and local prerogatives related to “gender violence”, between activists, NGOs, law operators, technicians and other state agents;

B. Regarding the research in Argentina

B1. Buenos Aires Province (La Plata and Florencio Varela)

- to analyze the Lei de Mediação Penal 13.433 (*Penal Mediation Act*) from the Buenos Aires Province, its origins and principles;
- to identify “gender violence” management methods and the access to justice through the actions and associations put forth by law operators in the judicial departments of La Plata

and Quilmes (Florencio Varela municipality);

- to identify “gender violence” management methods and the access to justice in the “Unidades Funcionales de Instrucción y Juicio” (*Functional Units of Instruction and Judgement*);
- to characterize the conflicts of action and meaning among law operators when dealing with “gender violence” cases;
- to identify education activities carried out by law and support operators;

B2. Salta Province (Orán and Tartagal)

- to analyze the *Decree of need for urgency* n° 2.654/14, transformed into the 7.857 act, its origins and principles;
- to monitor the 7.857 act, describing its implementation, through specific examples of daily interactions in the *Specialized Courts of Domestic and Gender Violence* from the Judicial District of Orán and Tartagal;
- to identify “gender violence” management methods and the access to justice in the *Specialized Courts of Domestic and Gender Violence* in Tartagal;
- to analyze the Programa Asistir (*Assistance Project*) and the effects of its implementation, focusing on the example of the *Specialized Courts of Domestic and Gender Violence* in Tartagal;
- to identify education activities carried out by law and support operators;
- to delve into the conflicts, disputes and contradictions of meanings and actions from law operators when dealing with cases of “gender violence”;

C. Regarding the establishment of networks

- to expand and strengthen partnerships with research groups in Brazil and abroad, especially in Argentina;
- to support the interchange of researchers between institutions that participate in the research, through *Pesquisador Visitante (PV)* and *Sanduiche no País (SWP)* scholarships;

D. Regarding cooperation activities between Brazil and Argentina

- to elaborate on the methodological and epistemological discussion about the comparative research perspective, considering two Latin American countries;
- to expand and strengthen international networks, through partnerships with Argentina, Canada and France;
- to contribute to the development of human resources through scholarships for the participation on the project.

E. Regarding the knowledge transfer and dissemination activities

- to promote the dissemination of research results through different means;
- to carry out workshops in schools, with the goal of promoting the discussion about “gender

violence”, practices of justice and alternative justice alongside children, teenagers, teachers and managerial staff in the field of education;

- to carry out workshops in non-governmental organizations, with the goal of promoting the discussion about “gender violence”, practices of justice and alternative justice alongside the public supported by these organizations;
- to promote the training of multiplier agents through workshops and discussion groups about topics surrounding “gender violence”, justice and alternative justice;
- to carry out meetings and events with the participation of managers, community leaders, technicians and other state agents to discuss public policies in the field;
- to carry out workshops together with managers and technicians with the goal of formulating guidelines for public policies in the field;
- to promote alternative practices of justice, through discussion groups, workshops and dissemination of information;
- to develop an informational and interactive website, conveying the results of the researches, workshops and intervention activities carried out in the context of the project;
- to publicize the work through national and international events (31^a RBA; XI RAM; III Encontro do Núcleo de Pesquisa em Psicologia Jurídica; Fazendo Gênero 11; 41^a ANPOCS; 18th World Congress IUAES);
- to hold two events for the meeting of teams and for the discussion of preliminary and final research results;
- to publish the research results: papers from different teams and authors; book with articles from the participating teams, to be distributed in printed and digital (ebook) forms;
- to hold team seminars gathering managers, visiting researchers (through the PV scholarship) and the international consultant (who is bearing the costs of the trip and stay in Brazil with his own resources)

5. METHODOLOGY

The research, primarily of qualitative and ethnographic nature, is characterized as multi-situated (MARCUS, 1995). The main field research activities will be the participating observation and the meticulous description of the observed contexts, actions, relationships and subjects (cf. CARDOSO DE OLIVEIRA, 1998; EMERSON, FRETZ, SHAW, 1995).

In regards to analysis, we will adopt the comparative approach (cf. KANT DE LIMA, 1991, 2011). Through this perspective, each experiment will be compared to the others in order to rethink specific categories and classification systems, and by doing so, to allow for the construction of a more comprehensive and critical language, from the contrasting comparisons we intend to make. To this end, each team will determine, based on local and specific experiences, the institutions and current projects from its location that could be relevant for the goals of the proposed research. Without such level of freedom and adjustment to the specific realities, the comparative project would lose its analytical strength and potential, being reduced to a simple generic application of predefined analysis parameters. Every specificity will be shared and will become topic of collective reflection in our quarterly team organization seminars, as a permanent effort towards the comparative approach.

Besides the comparative nature, the analysis of material related to social policy texts and of normative texts will be based on the perspective of discourse analysis: a work of “densification”, in the sense attributed by C. Geertz and P. Veyne (GEERTZ, 1978; HUNT, 1992), of the studied material, to the extent that we approach and question - through the discourses - values, representations and knowledge that substantiate the analyzed text.

It is important to point out that, while proposing a research project with goals that are also theoretical, we will carry out a comprehensive review of publications on the field of “gender violence” from Brazil and Argentina. This effort of surveying and literature reviewing will enable a critical examination of the analytical production itself, allowing us to elaborate on and be critical of our own work.

Finally, we emphasize a key aspect of the project: research ethics. Every procedure proposed on this project obeys the *Code of Ethics* of the Associação Brasileira de Antropologia (*Brazilian Anthropology Association*)¹, in regards to the 510/2016 *Resolution* from the Conselho Nacional de Saúde (*National Health Council*), that regulates the assessment of ethics in Social and Human Science research.

6. IMPACT

Through this project, we intend to contribute to the discussion surrounding dilemmas related to the fulfillment of citizenship rights and of access to justice (formal or alternative), specifically in regards to demands for rights associated with conflicts that arise from power inequalities in gender and generational relations. In a broader perspective, it will contribute in two fronts:

- 1) to the current discussion of enforcement of formal rights, more specifically, to the discussions surrounding the enforcement of the 11.340/2006 act and the use of the Estatuto do Idoso (*Statute of the Elderly* - 10.741/2003 act);
- 2) to the discussion about the expansion of areas of justice to beyond the judiciary and state law, creating extrajudicial spaces and enabling the identification of multiple “juridical sensibilities”.

We intend, at last, to sensitize and to inform people, groups, institutions, professionals, technicians, state agents, community groups, among other actors, about “gender violence”, Human Rights and the available services for support and promotion of justice.

7. EXPECTED PRODUCTION AND RESULTS

Throughout the 36 months of duration of the project, we aim at delivering preliminary and final reports, holding team meetings (in-person and via teleconference), organizing publications, carrying out workshops, participating in conferences and developing and managing a website about the research and extension activities. We also highlight the education of researchers by means of scholarships provided for by the project.

In addition, we plan to build tools and products that can be used by the education sector, other researchers and, especially, public managers. Among them, we mention:

7.1 Digital platforms and access to information on public policies: development of a bilingual website (Portuguese and Spanish), and of tools and digital interfaces for the distribution of information. Creation of a database that collects the available services, in each studied locality, that support both victims and perpetrators of “gender violence”.

7.2 Elaboration of informational material to be distributed to Brazilian institutions: creation of an informational leaflet with the main project results, including a table of available public services, identified public initiatives and new concepts and emerging paradigms that point to innovative practices in the field of “gender violence”. The material will be sent to police precincts and other studied institutions and organizations in order to be distributed to the population.

7.3 Dissemination of research results through publications and other kinds of media: academic publications. Dialogue with sectors of the press, independent groups and feminist and women’s organizations.

7.4 Training of multiplier agents: qualification of multiplier agents that will replicate in their schools, institutions, organizations and/or communities the discussions, information and mechanisms related to the fields of “gender violence”, justice and alternative justice. The training activities will be carried out by members of the project, through courses, lectures, workshops and discussion groups with multimedia resources, using multidisciplinary strategies of approach.

7.5 Development of diagnoses and guidelines for the formulation of public policies: formulation of diagnoses and guidelines that can assist and guide policymakers and enforcers of field-specific public policies, and that can identify directions and eventual challenges to the implementation of services and projects in each studied locality; creation of specific indicators that enable the proper evaluation and monitoring of measures put in place alongside the population.

8. EDUCATIONAL AND KNOWLEDGE DISSEMINATION ACTIVITIES

The educational and knowledge dissemination activities will take place in nine chosen locations in Brazil and Argentina. Based on the principle of indissolubility of research, education and knowledge dissemination, we believe that in both of these aspects we can obtain a two-way exchange: the research can shed light on processes of education and social intervention; and the educational and knowledge dissemination activities can elicit new elements, issues and questions about the resulting scholarly knowledge. The proposed activities are specified below.

8.1 Digital platform and media resources

A digital platform (the project's website) will be permanently supplied and maintained, through educational newsletters and interaction tools. There will be frequent cooperation between the researcher responsible for the dissemination activities and the Information Technology team, in order to advertise activities such as workshops, lectures, discussions and seminars. Educational videos, created from the work of the research teams, will also be made available on the website and allowed to be freely distributed by third parties. Therefore, the work created by the researchers will be accessible, and the acquired knowledge will be available to be spread through the platform and the in-person meetings.

It's worth noting that a key aspect of the development and maintenance of the digital platform is the bilingual nature of the information. Every content of the website will be made available in two languages: Portuguese and Spanish, which will maximize the dissemination of the research results and knowledge, increasing the access to the research material and the resulting discussions.

Regarding the communication with press mediums, the contact with the Agência de Comunicação (*Communication Agency - Agecom*) of the UFSC, and with analogous channels of the other involved universities stand out, in order to advertise the activities and provide updates about them.

8.2 Lectures and Workshops

Realization of two lectures and workshops on the theme of "gender violence" in each one of the cities hosting research teams, to be outlined based on the local characteristics. The target audience will be composed both of high school and university students, and of groups of women related to extension projects or educational programs, like the "Mulheres Mil" program (Setec/MEC) available at Institutos Federais (*Federal Institutes*).

About 10 workshops per team will be carried out, throughout the 36 months of the duration of the project: two during the first year, four on the second and four on the final year.

The workshops will last 2 hours and will be offered to groups of approximately 30 people, in schools, non-governmental organizations and/or in women's groups.

8.3 Workshops with the use of multimedia resources

We propose the realization, in Florianópolis and Lages, of quarterly sessions of discussion groups, open to the general public, in partner institutions that are able to host the event in return. There will be 12 sessions in each city, with the exhibition and discussion about movies related to the themes of "gender violence", justice and alternative justice.

8.4 Training of multiplier agents

Another important activity related to education and knowledge dissemination concerns the multiplier agents training seminars, each with 6 hours duration. These events will gather young people that could potentially replicate the knowledge to their peers in their communities, neighborhoods, schools and groups. To that end, five meetings will be carried out in Florianópolis and five in Lages, where, through teaching material to be elaborated by the research teams, the themes of "gender violence", justice and alternative justice will be addressed.

8.5 Meetings with governmental and non-governmental agents that work in the field

On the final stages of implementation of the project, meetings and events will take place, with the participation of managerial and technical professionals, community leaders, state and non-governmental agents that work on the justice system, social support networks, formal or informal educational areas and development of public policies against gender violence and towards alternative justice practices.

Five meetings will take place in the greater Florianópolis area and three in other locations - with the goal of sharing the results and indicators from the research, and of outlining proposals and guidelines directed towards public policies. Additionally, discussion groups will be held about the research results, alongside local groups organized around feminist, women's and human rights causes.

8.6 Knowledge dissemination in events and publications

Finally, the realization of two events for the meeting of research teams and the discussion of preliminary and final research results will be held, one of the events being open to managerial and educational professionals, and organized groups of the civil society. The research results will also be advertised in national and international events, besides being organized in different forms of publications.

Still following this line of activity, the production of a book reporting the results of the research and the production of a leaflet to be distributed by institutions that took part in the

research, to the general public supported by them - like detailed in the section **EXPECTED PRODUCTION AND RESULTS**.

9. KNOWLEDGE TRANSFER ACTIVITIES FOR THE ELABORATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF PUBLIC POLICIES

Through the use of ethnographic research, mapping of institutions and services, and description of practices and public measures, the goal of this proposal is to come up with a number of diagnoses on the overall picture of available services and mechanisms that support victims and perpetrators of “gender violence”.

These diagnoses, presented in the form of qualitative reports, analyses and descriptions, and created from discussions with technical staff, operators, professionals and users of the services, aim not only at indicating and describing assessments of existing services, but also at showing the objective conditions related to the implementation of public policies, initiatives and specific innovations. We intend to use this approach specially to foster the field of public policies towards “gender violence” cases, as the qualified hearing and reporting, from the analytical and methodological standpoint of distinct areas of knowledge, alongside different sectors, individuals and institutions, will point out elements that could help the operation and efficacy of policies of support for people involved in “gender violence” situations.

Once in possession of these diagnoses, and with the theoretical body of work that supports our research, we will carry out discussions and activities alongside state workers, security agents, law operators, health and social assistance technicians and other public agents with the goal of both disseminating our results and listening to them about reevaluating their practices, daily routines and experiences in the field. In addition to informing and training them, we intend to build (throughout the 3 years of duration of the project) viable and recurring channels of communication with these sectors, to allow reciprocal exchanges of knowledge. This is the general inspiration of this partnership, particularly with the Tribunal de Justiça de Santa Catarina (*Santa Catarina State Court of Justice*) and in relation with the support activities around the implementation of the project of Dr. Takaschima in the city of Lages.

These activities will consist of debates, workshops, discussion groups and informative and digital channels - like the website and the database to be developed. These approaches will allow the discussion of the research results with operators, technicians and other professionals, in order to create new possibilities and to disseminate new strategies of action towards the topic of discussion.

10. INFRASTRUCTURE AND TECHNICAL SUPPORT

The project's team of researchers has had extensive experience in the specific field of study and represents varied institutional affiliations. Each of the individual teams is supported by physical resources (computer laboratories, libraries, conference rooms) and equipment (computers, Internet access and teleconference devices, recorders, cameras) provided by their own institutions, laboratories or research groups. Regarding technical support, we anticipate a category of scholarship precisely for the realization of this role - the Apoio Técnico (*Technical Support*) scholarship.

The fact that teams provide their own equipment - and don't rely on acquisitions through project resources - is related to the focus of the project on field research, on events that allow us to gather team members and on activities to be carried out alongside sectors of education, the justice system and other public agents. Our budget will give priority, on the one hand, to transportation, lodging, daily rate costs and scholarships, with the goal of fostering empirical work, the creation of field research material, the exchanges and discussions between teams, the participation on project-related practices and initiatives and, above all, the qualification of young researchers. And, on the other hand, we will focus on the activities related to knowledge and research results dissemination, on the workshops in schools, on the development of tools and digital mechanisms and on the ground work, alongside managers and other state professionals, needed for the discussion and knowledge exchange surrounding the proposal and formulation of public policies.

11. CREATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH NETWORK

The periodic contact between the teams will be done through the exchange of informational emails and theoretical or managerial reports, online discussion groups and occasional videoconference meetings. Quarterly general meetings will be carried out through the Internet, for the realignment of researchers, when the direction of the project and the readjustment of research and extension activities will be discussed. Due to the importance of the virtual environment for the interaction between the teams, we intend to put effort into the development and improvement of a website that will allow the exchange and sharing of research data.

As another goal towards the communication between team members, we plan for meetings under the category of Visiting Researchers (PV), with the goal of promoting lectures, classes and/or short-term courses from the interchange of researchers between the participating institutions. In addition, another important way of interaction between the teams will be the involvement in field-related conferences, like the Reunião de Antropologia do Mercosul (RAM - *Mercosul Anthropology Meeting*), the Reunião Brasileira de Antropologia (RBA - *Brazilian Anthropology Meeting*) and the ANPOCS - events in which we will propose specific meetings, work groups and roundtable discussions between people directly and indirectly involved, taking the opportunities for meetings, discussions and exchanges about the project.

Finally, following the public notice recommendations this project proposal was submitted to, we plan for the realization of two events, at the midpoint and at the end of the lifetime of the project (18th and 36th months), for the presentation and discussion of the collective research results (preliminary and final, respectively). These events will not only serve as a way of gathering the participating teams, but also to encourage meetings and exchanges with other partners, political agents and members of the academic community. These events will assemble, in person, national consultants like Guita Grin Debert and Ana Lúcia Pastore Schritzmeyer, whose participations are provided for by this project's budget planning; and the international consultant Serge Charbonneau, who will use his own resources for the travel expenses. The regular interaction between all the collaborators and national and international consultants will also be made possible through periodic videoconference team meetings and the two comparative approach seminars.
